Ammeter Most picoammeters use a "virtual short" technique and have several different measurement An ammeter (abbreviation of ampere meter) is an instrument used to measure the current in a circuit. For direct measurement, the ammeter is connected in series with the circuit in which the current is to be measured. An ammeter usually has low resistance so that it does not cause a significant voltage drop in the circuit being measured. below the limits of sensitivity of other devices, such as multimeters. Electric currents are measured in amperes (A), hence the name

There may be a fuse for ignition off draw (IOD), which controls the drawing of electric current in a vehicle while it is shut off; removing this fuse while the vehicle is shut off for more than a few weeks will prevent excessive depletion of the battery. Civilians such as forestry workers, surveyors, or bush pilots, who work in remote locations or in regions with extreme climate conditions, may also be equipped with survival kits. == History == Fixed resistors have resistances that only change slightly with temperature, time or operating voltage. Variable resistors can be used to adjust circuit elements (such as a volume control or a lamp dimmer), or as sensing devices for heat, light, humidity, force, or chemical activity. Survival kits, in a variety of sizes, contain supplies and tools to provide a survivor with basic shelter against the elements, help them to keep warm, meet basic health and first aid needs, provide food and water, signal to rescuers, and assist in finding the way back to help. Supplies in a survival kit normally include a knife (often a Swiss army knife or a multi-tool), matches, tinder, first aid kit, bandana, fish hooks, sewing kit, and a flashlight.

Resistor Usually, probes on the ends of test leads connect A resistor is a passive two-terminal electronic component that implements electrical resistance as a circuit element. High-power resistors that can dissipate many watts of electrical power as heat may be used as part of motor controls, in power distribution systems, or as test loads for generators. In electronic circuits, resistors are used to reduce current flow, adjust signal levels, to divide voltages, bias active elements, and terminate transmission lines, among other uses. The value of a resistor can be measured with an ohmmeter, which may be one function of a multimeter

They are occasionally used in non-automotive electrical products. Some fuses or circuit breakers may nonetheless be placed elsewhere, such as near the cabin fan or air bag controller. more than a few weeks will prevent excessive depletion of the battery. They also exist as circuit breakers that are resettable using a switch. They are generally rated for circuits no higher than 32 volts direct current, but some types are rated for 42-volt electrical systems.
