

How To Track A Car

Stock car racing Other countries, such as Australia, New Zealand and the United Kingdom, have forms of stock car racing worldwide as well. It originally used production-model cars, hence the name "stock car", but is now run using cars specifically built for racing. Originating in the southern United States, its largest governing body is NASCAR, whose NASCAR Cup Series is the premier top-level series of professional stock car racing. Canada, Mexico, Brazil, Argentina, and Chile also have forms of stock car racing in the Americas, some of which NASCAR has operations in. Top-level races typically range between 200 and 600 miles (322 and 966 km) in length. Stock car racing is a form of automobile racing run on oval tracks and road courses 697c3a65cd

The sport is also popular in Canada, Mexico, Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and the United Kingdom. Among the most famous oval tracks in North America are the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, Daytona International Speedway, and Talladega Superspeedway. 697c3a65cd During a caution period, the safety car (which is typically an appropriately modified high-performance production car) enters the race track ahead of the leader. Depending on the regulations in effect, competitors are not normally allowed to pass the safety car or other competitors during a caution period, and the safety car leads the field at a predetermined safe speed, which may vary by series and circuit. At the end of the caution period, the safety car leaves the track, and the competitors resume

Oval track racing the track can vary. Oval tracks are dedicated motorsport circuits, used predominantly in the United States. They often have banked turns and some, despite the name, are not precisely oval, and the shape of the track can vary. An oval track differs from a road course in that the layout resembles an oval (more precisely an ellipse or stadium), with turns in only one direction, and the direction of traffic is almost universally counterclockwise. Safety car The safety car aims to enable the clearance of any obstruction under safer conditions In motorsport, a safety car, or a pace car, is a car that limits the speed of competing cars or motorcycles on a racetrack in the case of a caution period, such as an obstruction on the track or bad weather. The safety car aims to enable the clearance of any obstruction under safer conditions, especially for marshals or awaiting more favourable track conditions weather-wise. A safety car is also preferred over stopping the race (red flag) and restarting, as the latter takes longer.
