Aspidistra They grow in shade under trees and shrubs. The number of species known has increased considerably from the 1980s onwards, with around 100 accepted as of July 2013. It and other species can also be grown in shade outside, where they are generally hardy to -15°C (5°F). *Aspidistra* /ˌæsprɪˈdɪstrə/ is a genus of flowering plants in the family Asparagaceae, subfamily Convallarioideae, native to eastern and southeastern Asia *Aspidistra* is a genus of flowering plants in the family Asparagaceae, subfamily Convallarioideae, native to eastern and southeastern Asia, particularly China and Vietnam. Their leaves arise more or less directly from ground level, where their flowers also appear. *Aspidistra elatior* is common worldwide as a foliage house plant that is very tolerant of neglect

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Hambleton Cottage was built between 1821 and 1824 on the north western corner of the 100 acre grant made to John Macarthur, soldier, entrepreneur and pastoralist, in 1793. This grant formed the basis of the 850 acre Elizabeth Farm Estate, which included Elizabeth Farm. It was originally believed that the cottage was constructed for his children's governess, Penelope Lucas, who served as the family governess when John Macarthur returned from London in 1805. However, it has been more recently accepted that it was constructed to supplement the accommodation at Elizabeth farm more generally. 395544a88a Species of *Aspidistra* are perennial herbaceous plants growing from rhizomes. The leaves are either solitary or are grouped in small "tufts" of two to four. They arise more or less directly from the rhizome, rather than being borne on stems. Each leaf has a long stalk (petiole) and a blade with many veins. The flowering stem (scape) is usually very short so that the flowers appear low down among the leaves. The fleshy flowers are bell-, urn- or cup-shaped. They vary considerably in size and shape, although few are showy. Specimens are also present within the forest area of the Tokyo Imperial Palace. 395544a88a == Description == 395544a88a Plants and animals associated with this tree include: 395544a88a *Acrocercops mantica*, *Chrysocercops castanopsidis*, and *Lymantria albescens* larvae of these Asian moths likely mine the leaves. 395544a88a Ashdown Forest originated as a medieval hunting forest created soon after the Norman Conquest of England. By 1283 the forest was fenced in by a 23 miles (37 km) pale enclosing an area of 20 square miles (52 km²; 13,000 acres; 5,200 ha). Thirty-four gates and hatches in the pale, still remembered in place names such as Chuck Hatch and Chelwood Gate, allowed local people to enter to graze their livestock, collect firewood, and cut heather and bracken for animal bedding. The forest continued to be used by the monarchy and nobility for hunting into Tudor times, including notably Henry VIII, who had a hunting lodge at Bolebroke Castle, Hartfield and who courted Anne Boleyn at nearby Hever Castle. 395544a88a

== Care == 395544a88a The Garden Island Naval Precinct, incorporates Fleet Base East, including the Garden Island Dockyard and adjacent facility Sydney Maritime Headquarters (MHQ) at Potts Point. The site was formerly part of Sir John Hay's experimental garden, which covered much of the eastern hill face of Edgecliff/Double Bay (an unusual listing in the 1880 Sands Directory, at the time Sir John Hay resided in Rose Bay Lodge (now Rose Bay Cottage)), running from Ocean Street on the ridge (western boundary) to Manning Street, Double Bay (in the east). Hay was the NSW Colonial Treasurer and owned the property prior to the construction of Overthorpe. He was also vice-president of the Agricultural Society of NSW (1860-1865; 1868-1881; 1888-1889); and vice-president of NSW commissions for International Exhibitions at Philadelphia, Paris, Sydney and Amsterdam, roles consistent with 19th century ambitions to cultivate an "experimental" garden. 395544a88a Growing to 60 cm (24 in) tall and wide, it is an evergreen rhizomatous perennial, with glossy dark-green leaves 30-50 cm (12-20 in) long and fleshy 8-lobed cream flowers with maroon colouring on the inner surface borne in early summer. 395544a88a
