It is one of the main health and environmental hazards associated with paint. Alternatives such as water-based, lead-free traffic paint are readily available. Lead is added to paint to accelerate drying, increase durability, maintain a fresh appearance, and resist moisture that causes corrosion. Lead paint or lead-based paint is paint containing lead. Lead paint has been generally phased out of use due to the toxic nature of lead. In response to rising concerns over occupational lead poisoning, the Home Secretary appointed a departmental committee in January 1911 to investigate dangers in the building industry. This inquiry catalysed a major debate between public works administrators and private trade associations regarding the feasibility of a total ban on white lead. H.M. Office of Works advocated heavily for a transition to zinc oxide alternatives. Under the institutional direction of Principal Architect Sir Henry Tanner, West London Clerk of Works George Dobson Patterson evaluated extensive real-world trials testing customised zinc formulas on major Crown properties, including royal residences like Buckingham Palace and the Post Office Savings Bank building at Blythe House. Lead poisoning Lead poisoning causes almost 10% of intellectual disability of otherwise unknown cause and can result in behavioral problems. lead poisoning occurred when toxicity in children from lead paint was recognized in Australia in 1897. In severe cases, anemia, seizures, coma, or death may occur. Symptoms of lead poisoning may include abdominal pain, constipation, headaches, irritability, memory problems, infertility, numbness and tingling in the hands and feet. Some of the effects are permanent. In 2017, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development estimated that approximately 35 percent of U.S. homes (37 million) still contain some lead-based paint, a decline from 1990 estimate of 64 million homes with lead paint. f7bae93d20

Baltimore Lead Paint Study Families with young children were deliberately exposed to lead by being housed with their families in apartments where lead paint had not been completely removed. The Baltimore Lead Paint Study was a controversial clinical study conducted by the Johns Hopkins Kennedy Krieger Institute (KKI) in poor Baltimorean neighborhoods The Baltimore Lead Paint Study was a controversial clinical study conducted by the Johns Hopkins Kennedy Krieger Institute (KKI) in poor Baltimorean neighborhoods during the 1990s. Researchers hoped to show that less stringent lead abatement techniques that would cost landlords less money would pose minimal health risks to children. The study was criticised for targeting poor African American children, for exposing children to a known health risk and for inadequate participant consent. The backlash culminated in class action lawsuits against KKI by Ericka Grimes and Myron Higgins, two of the subjects representing on the order of a hundred affected children without adequate care f7bae93d20

== Types == f7bae93d20 Exposure to lead can occur through contaminated air, water, dust, food, or consumer products. Lead poisoning poses a significantly increased risk to children and pets as they are far more likely to ingest lead indirectly by chewing on toys or other objects that are coated in lead paint. Additionally, children absorb greater quantities of lead from ingested sources than adults. Exposure at work is a common cause of lead poisoning in adults, with certain occupations at particular risk. Diagnosis is typically by measurement of the blood lead level. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (US) has set the upper limit for blood lead for adults at 10 µg/dL (10 µg/100... f7bae93d20

The usage of such a material led to the deaths of many, most famously the Radium Girls. After the discovery of the adverse effects of radium exposure, many countries banned the usage of radium paint. In many countries, lead paint remains permitted for domestic use, whereas in other jurisdictions, such as the United States, the United Kingdom and the European Union, there are regulations prohibiting or restricting its use. However, lead paint may still be found in older properties painted prior to the introduction of such regulations. In 1971, Congress banned the use of lead-based paint in residential projects (including residential structures and environments) constructed by, or with the assistance of, the federal government. The Consumer Product Safety Commission followed with implementing regulations, effective in 1978. Water-based paints and oil-based paints will cure differently based on the outside ambient temperature of the object being painted (such as a house). f7bae93d20

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
