Walpole rebuilt the existing house in stages starting in 1749, 1760, 1772 and 1776. These additions introduced Gothic features such as towers and battlements outside and elaborate decoration inside to create "gloomth" to suit Walpole's collection of antiquarian objects, contrasting with the more cheerful or "riant" (lit. 'laughing') garden. The interior included gilded ceilings and intentionally grand fireplaces—with one by Robert Adam, along with small details like enamelled door handles, carved wooden screens, and ancestral-looking coats of arms; parts of the exterior were designed by James Essex. unknown. The species *Rheum rhabarbarum* (syn. *R. undulatum*) and *R. rhaponticum* were grown in Europe before the 18th century and used in folk medicine. By the early 18th century, these two species and a possible hybrid of unknown origin, *R. × hybridum*, were grown as vegetable crops in England and Scandinavia. They readily hybridize, and culinary rhubarb was developed by selecting open-pollinated seed, so its precise origin is almost impossible to determine. In appearance, samples of culinary rhubarb vary on a continuum between *R. rhaponticum* and *R. rhabarbarum*. On 9 September 2018, several days prior to any official announcement of contamination, a Facebook user posted a warning about Berry Obsession strawberries purchased from Woolworths Strathpine Centre in Moreton Bay, north of Brisbane. The user reported that his friend had swallowed part of a needle and was in the emergency department at hospital. A second victim had called Woolworths on 11 September. The affected strawberries were not withdrawn and the

contamination was not publicly reported until 12 September. Rhubarb The large, triangular leaves contain high levels of oxalic acid and anthrone glycosides, making them poisonous and therefore inedible. Historically, different plants have been called "rhubarb" in English. The small flowers are grouped in large compound leafy greenish-white to rose-red inflorescences. Plants of Rhubarb is the fleshy, edible stalks (petioles) of species and hybrids (culinary rhubarb) of *Rheum* in the family Polygonaceae, which are cooked and used for food.
