The Census Bureau ranked McKinney as the nation's fourth fastest-growing large city from 2010 to 2019 and determined the city's 2020 population was 195,308. The town was originally to be named "Carney", in honor of a citizen who owned a sawmill in the town. Mr. Carney's brother had already established a town nearby with the same name, and Mr. Carney was allowed to name the town after his close friend C.P. Atmore, General Passenger Agent of the Louisville and Nashville Railroad. Mr. Atmore never visited the town. edee3cf5d6

On March 24, 1849, William Davis, who owned 3,000 acres (12 km²) where McKinney now stands, donated 120 acres (0.49 km²) for the townsite.

Berner, a prominent Macon attorney and former state legislator, filed a petition on September 28, 1912, with the Georgia Railroad Commission, asking that the railroads calling at Macon be required to erect an adequate union passenger station in Macon. His efforts culminated in the construction of Terminal Station, which was officially opened in 1916. edee3cf5d6 The company was purchased by the Southern Railway in 1963, and subsequently became part of Norfolk Southern Railway in 1982. edee3cf5d6 The Terminal Station building has a limestone exterior, with the main lobby and waiting areas having floors and walls of pink Tennessee marble. edee3cf5d6 == History == edee3cf5d6 Native Americans around Collin County and North Texas included the Caddo, Comanche, Cherokee, Delaware, Kickapoo, and Tonkawa. Terminal Station (Macon, Georgia) at the end of Cherry St. - Cincinnati Knoxville - Atlanta - St. While no longer an active train station, it has been the location of the Macon Transit Authority bus hub since 2014. Central of Georgia Railway It started as the Central Rail Road and Canal Company in 1833. It took from 1837 to 1843 to build the railroad from Savannah to the eastern bank of the Ocmulgee River at Macon; a bridge into the city was not built until 1851. This railroad was constructed to join the Macon and Western Railroad at Macon, Georgia, in the United States, and run to Savannah. This created a rail link from

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Chattanooga, on the Tennessee River, to seaports on the Atlantic Ocean. to approve a merger of the two roads, so the Frisco sold its CofG stock to the Southern Railway in 1963. As a way to better attract investment capital, the railroad changed its name to Central Rail Road and Banking Company of Georgia.
