List of Casualty specials supports the introduction of four new student nurse characters; "Gone in Sixty Seconds" gives an insight into a bus crash; "Mrs Walker-To-Be" explores Casualty is a British medical drama television series that premiered in the United Kingdom on BBC One on 6 September 1986. The drama has aired for 40 series with over 1,000 episodes having aired in total. The drama was created by Jeremy Brock and Paul Unwin, while Geraint Morris produced the first three series. It is the longest-running emergency medical drama television series in the world, and the most enduring medical drama broadcast on primetime television in the world. The two shows are closely related with several crossover events occurring between them. Casualty is set in the fictional Holby City Hospital and focuses on the staff and patients of the hospital's emergency department (ED). Holby City, a spin-off of Casualty, was commissioned in 1998 and aired from 12 January 1999 until 29 March 2022. A British police procedural drama and spin-off to Casualty, HolbyBlue was announced on 27 April 2006. It began on 8 May 2007 and was cancelled in August 2008 after 2 series and 20 episodes were broadcast. Some crossovers broadcast between December 2004 and December 2005 are styled as episodes of Casualty@Holby City

Goddard was born in Croydon, London, England, in 1962. Between 1974 and 1979, he attended Ravensbourne School, Hayes Lane, Bromley, London. A punk in 1977, he helped form a band at school called The Belsen Horrors (the name of which came from a Sex Pistols track). First a drummer, then the lead singer, he and his band lasted until 1978. Bromley was closely linked with the early punk movement – first through the Bromley Contingent (the first fans of the Sex Pistols), and three famous punk singers who came from this town: Poly Styrene (X-Ray Spex), Siouxsie Sioux (of Siouxsie and the Banshees) and Billy Idol – who...
Because the team colors were indistinguishable on monochrome-only television sets (which were still somewhat common in 1975), the words "REDS" and "BLUES" were later printed on the front of each team member's sweater for the benefit of home viewers.

In the summer of 1940, Robert “Doc” Epple borrowed \$10,000 from his father to invest as part owner of the University Bookstore. Mervyn LeRoy LeRoy left Warners and moved to Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer studios in 1939 to serve as both director and producer. He is best known for producing the 1939 film *The Wizard of Oz*, as well as for directing the 1951 Oscar-nominated film *Quo Vadis*. earned supporting actor Jack Lemmon his first Oscar. LeRoy assumed the dual role of director-producer in the late Fifties and Sixties, during the declining Mervyn LeRoy (; October 15, 1900 – September 13, 1987) was an American film director and producer. During the 1930s, he was one of the two great practitioners of economical and effective film directing at Warner Brothers studios, the other being his colleague Michael Curtiz. LeRoy's most acclaimed films of his tenure at Warners include *Little Caesar* (1931), *I Am a Fugitive From a Chain Gang* (1932), *Gold Diggers of 1933* (1933), *Anthony Adverse* (1936), and *They Won't Forget* (1937) d46511014e

Fleming portrayed Bond as a tall, athletic, handsome secret agent in his thirties or forties. Bond has several vices, including drinking, smoking, gambling, automobiles and womanising. He is an exceptional marksman, and he is skilled in unarmed combat, skiing, swimming and golf.
