Born and raised in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, Gill received his Bachelor of Fine Arts in 1991 from Mount Allison University, where he studied sculpture and printmaking. In 1997, he moved to St. John's, Newfoundland.

"Some of Gill's notable works have drawn upon the Newfoundland landscape. In the 2009 performance *Cape Spear*, he tossed fibreglass-encased glow sticks off of the easternmost point of North America using a catapult." "The 2009 installation *Bareneed* is a replica of a cast-iron bathtub that Gill saw on the bottom of the ocean floor while sea-kayaking near the titular coastal community (the artist himself has noted that the St. John's setting has been key to his art production)." In March 2013, Gill was selected from a group of 31 artists to create an indoor public art installation in the lobby of a new office building in St. John's, set to open in the spring of 2014 - the first private juried art commission in the province awarded to a local artist. At the age of 12, Burden had emergency surgery, performed without anesthesia, on his left foot after he was severely injured in a motor-scooter crash on the island of Elba. During the long convalescence that followed, he became deeply interested in visual art, particularly photography. He studied for his B.A. in visual arts, physics and architecture at Pomona College in 1965–1969 and received his MFA at the University of California, Irvine—where his teachers included Robert Irwin—from 1969 to 1971. Kawamata's fascination for Tokyo's urban landscape and its constant transformation soon led to the development of larger-scale installations in situ in cities in Japan and abroad. After having participated in the Venice Biennale in 1982 at only 28 years old, Kawamata's subsequent projects led him to work across Europe, North America, and South America. At the age of 32, Ryman began to make sculptures of the characters in his plays in an effort to “envision them more fully.” Ryman created these sculptures out of a desire to "let the play's scenery tell the whole story, and to create theater with no lines or actors, but just the world itself." dd0fd54f79 Built in 1899 to the designs of architect Frank Matcham as an opera house and theatre, the Gaiety, along with the nearby Villa Marina, stands on the site of a lodge occupied in the early 19th century by Castle Mona architect and Atholl family

retainer George Steuart, and then later bought by benefactor Henry Bloom Noble and donated for recreational use. The U.S. Coast Artillery fire control system included many fire control towers. These were introduced in the U.S. with the Endicott Program, and were used between about 1900 and the end of WWII. These ephemeral installations raise questions about architecture and its permanence, and have drawn attention to social realities, such as the stark class difference apparent in large cities. Since the 2000s, the artist's installations have taken on an increasingly ecological charge, confronting environmental disasters, such as the accumulation of waste or the aftermath of the 2011 Tōhoku earthquake and tsunami. == Early life and education == In 1999, Ryman's Absurdist play *The Encounter* debuted at New York's Trilogy Theater.

Rosemary Johnson was born in Christchurch in 1942, the youngest daughter of Richard Nayott Darvall Johnson and his wife Rose Eleanor Clare. She attended the University of Canterbury School of Art from 1961 and graduated with a diploma in Fine Arts in sculpture, the only student of her year to be awarded Honours. In 1966 she went to study at the Central School of Art and Design in London. There she specialised in metal casting and developed an interest in the bronze cast sculptures of Henry Moore. After leaving the Central School she continued her training in the bronze casting process in Germany. Johnson kept a close association with New Zealand while in the UK and sent work back for exhibition. For example, the fibreglass sculpture *Bird Sleeping* was included in the 1968 Christchurch Festival exhibition. She also exhibited in the UK. She participated in the Brighton Festival in 1968 and in shows with the John Whibley Gallery and Jacey Galleries in

Fire control tower This made fire control more complex. The Atlantic Wall in German-occupied Europe during World War II included fire control towers. Fire control towers came into general use in coastal defence systems in the late 19th century, as rapid development significantly increased the range of both naval guns and coastal artillery. These towers were used in a number of countries' coastal defence systems through 1945, much later in a few cases such as Sweden.
