Sydney Gay and Lesbian Mardi Gras Sydney Mardi Gras is the largest gay and lesbian event in Oceania. In 2019, an attempt was made to alter the name to include more groups under the queer umbrella, but this was voted down by the gay and lesbian members, who wanted the event to remain exclusive. It first began as a protest for gay and lesbian people in 1978. Woman Suffrage Procession As stated in its official program, the parade's purpose was to "march in a spirit of protest against the present political organization of society, from which women are excluded. The procession was organized by the suffragists Alice Paul and Lucy Burns for the National American Woman Suffrage Association (NAWSA). C.
