The blade of the leaf is up to 50 cm long, and is wider than its length. The leaves are heart-shaped at the base with five prominent nerves. The petioles are concave above and convex below, with about 10 ridges. The flowers are borne in a panicle and are light greenish-yellow in colour. The fruits have membrane-like wings and are about 5 mm long on pedicels (stems) of the same length. a294196fd7 == Description == a294196fd7 In late spring the flowers emerge before the leaves, with rounded cymes of numerous five-petalled white to bright pink flowers (measuring up to 1.5 cm across each) borne on flower stems up to 2 m (6 ft 7 in) long. The leaves, up to 60 cm (24 in) long and wide, are peltate, rounded, deeply lobed, coarsely toothed, conspicuously veined and dark green, also on stems petioles up to 2 m (6 ft 7 in) height. These are likely defenses against the increased UV-B exposure and extreme cold in its high altitude range. It also provides a safe haven for its pollinators against wind and night chill. a294196fd7 == Description == a294196fd7 The precise origin of culinary rhubarb is unknown. The species *Rheum rhabarbarum* (syn. *R. undulatum*) and *R. rhaponticum* were grown in Europe before the 18th century and used in folk medicine. By the early 18th century, these two species and a possible hybrid of unknown origin, *R. x hybridum*, were grown as vegetable crops in England and Scandinavia. They readily hybridize, and culinary rhubarb was developed by selecting open-pollinated seed, so its precise origin is almost impossible to determine. In appearance, samples of culinary rhubarb vary on a continuum between *R. rhaponticum* and *R. rhabarbarum*. However, modern rhubarb cultivars are tetraploids with... a294196fd7 The plant has a 1.5-2m high stem. Its stem is stout, red, and streaked green and brown. The large leaves are heart-shaped or roundish with a heart-shaped base, and greenish-red in colour. The basal leaves can be up to 60 cm wide. a294196fd7 *Gunnera manicata* is a large, clump-forming herbaceous perennial growing to 2.5 m (8 ft) tall by 4 m (13 ft) or more in width. The leaves of *G. manicata* grow to an impressive size. Leaves with diameters well in excess of 1.2 metres (3 ft 11 in) are commonplace, with a spread of 3 by 3 metres (10 ft × 10 ft) on a mature plant. The largest on record had leaves up to 3.4 m (11 ft) in width. It is the largest of all the *Gunnera* species, but not the tallest (see *Gunnera masafuerae*). The underside of the leaf and the whole stalk have spikes on them. In early summer it bears tiny red-green, dimerous flowers in conical branched panicles, followed by small, spherical fruit. Like most gunneras, it has a symbiotic relationship with certain blue-green algae which provide nitrogen by fixation. a294196fd7 == Taxonomy == a294196fd7
