Tenebrio is the Latin generic name that Carl Linnaeus assigned to some flour beetles in his 10th edition of *Systema Naturae* 1758–59. The name means "lover of darkness"; the English language term 'darkling' means "characterised by darkness or obscurity"; see also English 'tenebrous', figuratively "obscure, gloomy." eb5b8855ec Many Tenebrionidae species inhabit dark places; in genera such as *Stenocara* and *Onymacris*, they are active by day and inactive at night. eb5b8855ec The subfamily Ripiphorinae parasitise bees and wasps (Hymenoptera), while Ripidiinae parasitises cockroaches (Blattodea) and Pelecotominae parasitises larvae of wood-boring beetles (Coleoptera). eb5b8855ec == History == eb5b8855ec The name derives from traditional woodworking tools: a beetle, a heavy wooden mallet, and a wedge, used together for splitting timber. eb5b8855ec Adult and larval leaf beetles feed on a variety of plant tissue, with some being specialists of particular species or families of plant. Many are serious pests of cultivated plants, for example the Colorado potato beetle (*Leptinotarsa decemlineata*), the asparagus beetle (*Crioceris asparagi*), the cereal leaf beetle (*Oulema melanopus*), the mustard beetle (*Phaedon cochleariae*) and various flea beetles, and a few act as vectors of plant diseases. Others are beneficial due to their use in biocontrol of invasive weeds. Some Chrysomelidae are conspicuously colored, typically in glossy yellow to red or metallic blue-green hues, and some (especially Cassidinae) have spectacularly bizarre shapes. Thus, they are highly popular among insect collectors. eb5b8855ec Other than the typical long antennal length, the most consistently distinctive feature of adults of this family is that the antennal sockets are located on low tubercles on the face; other beetles with long antennae lack these tubercles, and cerambycids with short antennae still possess them. They otherwise vary greatly in size, shape, sculpture, and coloration. A number of species mimic ants, bees, and wasps, though most species are cryptically colored. Other species like the Australian *Chychramptodes murrayi* are known to feed on scale insects. There are a few pest species, like the strawberry sap beetle that infest crops in Brazil between the months of August and February. Most species are characterized by antennae as long as or longer than the beetle's body. A few species have short antennae (e.g., *Neandra brunnea*), making them difficult to distinguish from related families such as Chrysomelidae. "Cerambycidae" comes from a Greek mythological figure; after an argument with nymphs, the shepherd Cerambus is transformed into a large beetle with horns. == Overview ==

This species described by Louis Mandelli based on specimens from Sikkim and placed in the genus *Heterorhynchus* which was however preoccupied leading to it briefly being placed in the genus *Stachyrrhynchus* by Hume. However the genus *Sphenocichla* was erected before this by Godwin-Austen and Lord Tweeddale for the Manipur or Cachar wedge-billed babbler and this species was moved to the genus *Sphenocichla*. Molecular phylogenetic analysis indicated that the species in the genus *Sphenocichla* were nested amid species of *Stachyris* leading to them being merged into the older described genus *Stachyris*.
