The idea helps connect scattered efforts to address environmental issues in architecture, agriculture, engineering, landscape architecture, and ecological restoration, among others. The term was first used in architecture by Sim Van der Ryn and Stuart Cowan in 1996. The term had been in common use in landscape architecture since the 1960s. In 1993, a conference was held at Arizona State University that included many ecological design leaders, including Ian McHarg. There An assisted living residence or assisted living facility (ALF) is a housing facility for people with disabilities or for adults who cannot or who choose not to live independently. The term is popular in the United States. A consumer-driven industry, assisted living offers a wide range of options, levels of care, and diversity of services (Lockhart, 2009) and is subject to state rather than federal regulatory oversight. Alternatively, individual living spaces may resemble a dormitory or hotel room with a private or semi-private sleeping area and a shared bathroom. Defensible space theory Newman argues that architectural and environmental design play a crucial part in increasing or reducing criminality. The theory was developed in the early 1970s, and he wrote his first book on the topic, *Defensible Space*, in 1972. Defensible space works with a hierarchy of living and community spaces. will ensure a safe living environment for those that care for it. The book contains a study from New York that pointed out that higher crime rates existed in high-rise housing projects than in low-rise complexes. According to the The defensible space theory of architect and city planner Oscar Newman encompasses ideas about crime prevention and neighborhood safety. This, he concluded, was because residents felt no control or personal responsibility for an area occupied by so many people. Throughout his study, Newman focused on explaining his ideas on social control, crime prevention, and public health in relation to community design 44db2db4ca

Milton Small, FAIA (1916–1992). Small had studied under Mies van der Rohe at the Illinois Institute of Technology before moving to Raleigh in 1948. There is some variation in defining a tiny home, but there are examples and they are usually based on floorspace. The International Residential Code states that a tiny house's floorspace is no larger than 400 square feet (37 m²). Merriam-Webster says they can be up to 500 ft². One architectural firm used a threshold of 600 ft² to define a tiny home.
