The cuisine is based on fresh ingredients with recipes based around a fish or meat dish. Truman After Mount St. On May 18, 1980, Truman was killed in the cataclysmic eruption of Mount St. Truman (October 30, 1896 – May 18, 1980) was an American businessman, bootlegger, and prospector. Sam Cooke Considered one of the most influential soul artists of all time, Cooke is commonly referred to as the "King of Soul" for his distinctive vocals, pioneering contributions to the genre, and significance in popular music. His family has since questioned the circumstances of his death. In 1964, he was shot and killed by the manager of a motel in Los Angeles. After an inquest and investigation, the courts ruled Cooke's death to be a justifiable homicide. During his thirteen-year career, Cooke released 29 singles that charted in the Top 40 of the Billboard Hot 100 chart, as well as 20 singles in the Top 10 of Billboard's Black Singles chart. Sam Cooke died as he is said to have died: killed by a motel owner at a cheap motel in Los Angeles called the Hacienda which he had gone to with a prostitute Samuel Cooke (né

Cook; January 22, 1931 – December 11, 1964) was an American soul singer and songwriter debd5bc4c2

In 2015, Cooke was ranked number 28 in Billboard magazine's list of the "35 Greatest R&B Artists of All Time". debd5bc4c2 Upon its release, *Meet Me in St. Louis* was both a critical and a commercial success. Donahue was born in Dublin, Ireland c.1806. An orphan, he began pick-pocketing and, after later involvement in a burglary, was convicted of intent to commit a felony in 1823. After being detained aboard HMS *Surprise*, a convict hulk moored in Cork, in September 1824, he was transferred to the ship *Ann and Amelia* and transported with 200 other prisoners to Australia, arriving in Sydney in January 1825. Upon being shown his cell at Carter's barracks, Donahue remarked 'A home for life'. During his early imprisonment, he was twice sentenced to fifty lashes as punishment. debd5bc4c2 Pro made his fortune as a pirate cruising the Indian Ocean against Moorish shipping, possibly alongside David Williams or Thomas Collins. They returned to the pirate trading post at Ile Ste Marie off the Madagascar coast to divide their treasure. Adam Baldrige had abandoned the settlement in 1697 after a Malagasy uprising, but Pro remained behind to rebuild. In 1703 Williams and Collins were captured by fellow ex-pirate Aert Van Tuyl after they and the crew of Thomas Howard's ship *Prosperous* got into a fight with Van Tuyl and his native allies.
