Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park The City of London and Tower Hamlets Cemetery Company bought Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park is a public park, historic deconsecrated cemetery and local nature reserve in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets within the East End of London. They registered as a charity in 2004 and manage the park on behalf of the council. It is one of the "Magnificent Seven" London cemeteries of the Victorian era, built because parish churchyards had become overcrowded. The Friends of Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park were formed in 1990 to protect its landscape, historic monuments and biodiversity for the benefit of

the public. Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park encompasses the original cemetery, bounded by historic walls, and additional land including the Scrapyard Meadow and the Ackroyd Drive Greenlink. metropolitan area. It contains nine Grade II listed monuments and features. Purchased by the Greater London Council, with the intention of clearing it for a public park, it passed to Tower Hamlets Council in 1986. The Soanes Centre is located in the park. The cemetery opened in 1841 and was formally named the City of London and Tower Hamlets Cemetery, although it was commonly known as Bow Cemetery. It closed in 1966 after 350,000 burials. Kensal Green was the first, opened in 1833, and Tower Hamlets the last in 1841 703a139818

The cemetery was immortalised in the lines of G. K. Chesterton's poem "The Rolling English Road" from his book *The Flying Inn*: 703a139818

Kensal Town The Kensal Town is a district of North West London, located partly in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, and partly in the City of Westminster. The Grand Union Canal, which passes through it, forms the boundary of the two boroughs. The cemetery, founded in 1858, is the resting place of over 165,000 Roman Catholics. Notable burials include British spy Peter Ashmun Ames, conductor Sir John Barbirolli, and activist Marcus Garvey. The cemetery, which is open year-round, features a chapel used for funeral and memorial services. The origin of the area was as a well wooded, 144 acre, exclave of the Manor and Ancient Parish of Chelsea, since at least the time of Edward the Confessor, prior to the Norman Conquest, when oaks from the area were used to build Westminster Abbey. It was then known as Chelsea-in-the-Wilderness or the Hamlet of Kensal Town. 703a139818 The name 'Kensal' is derived from Kingisholt, meaning 'King's Wood', first recorded in 1253. The Wood was probably

located in the exclave of Chelsea now known as Kensal Town. The name 'Kensal Green' was first recorded in 1550 and applied to a long area of roadside common land, to the west of Kensal Town, in the ancient parish of Willesden. They were established in the 19th century to alleviate overcrowding in existing parish burial grounds as London's population grew during the Victorian era. These are Kensal Green Cemetery, West Norwood Cemetery, Highgate Cemetery, Abney Park Cemetery, Brompton Cemetery, Nunhead Cemetery, and Tower Hamlets Cemetery. In 1981, the architectural historian Hugh Meller dubbed the group of cemeteries "The Magnificent Seven" after the 1960 western film of the same name. This explains the etymology of many local place names (e.g. All Souls' Avenue, College Road, All Souls Cemetery). All Souls' College owned the vast majority of land in "old Kensal Green", extending northwards in two prongs towards Willesden Green and Harlesden Green and in many respects it was an extra-parochial area. 703a139818 The area is focussed on Harrow Road and situated about 4.4 miles (7.1 km) miles north-west of Charing Cross. Kensal Green is best known for the Grade I listed Kensal Green Cemetery, one of London's 'Magnificent Seven cemeteries'. The cemetery, which is still used for new burials, includes several chapels and the West London Crematorium. 703a139818 The chapel was the first purpose-built Nonconformist chapel to be built in a public cemetery. The eastern spur of the cemetery was reserved for the use of dissenters. A competition to build the chapel was won by Henry Edward Kendall, with a design in Gothic style. However the contract was awarded to John Griffith of Finsbury. Griffith was surveyor to the General Cemetery Company, and his design was in Greek Revival style. The chapel was built between 1831 and 1834. 703a139818 Despite its Grecian-style buildings, the cemetery is primarily Gothic in character, due to the high number of private Gothic monuments. Due to this atmosphere, the cemetery was the chosen location of several scenes in movies, notably in Theatre of Blood. 703a139818 Small-scale development of Kensal started with the opening of the Paddington Arm of the Grand Junction Canal (later Grand Union Canal) in 1801.... 703a139818 The housing stock in College Park is largely bay-fronted Victorian terraced houses built in the late 1800s. Kenmont Primary School is at its centre and within the neighbourhood is The Mayhew Animal Home. 703a139818 The Masons Arms is included in CAMRA's national inventory, for having "an interior of special historic interest". CAMRA have launched a petition to save pub and its

historic interior from demolition. 703a139818 To the west lies Harlesden, to the east are Maida Hill and Westbourne. Queen's Park and Brondesbury are to the north-east, Willesden is to the north-west, and Notting Hill lies to the south. 703a139818 Established in 1858, the 29-acre (120,000 m2) site was built next door to Kensal Green Cemetery. It is the final resting place for more than 165,000 individuals of the Roman Catholic faith, and features a memorial to Belgian soldiers of the First World War, wounded in combat and evacuated to England, where they died in hospital. 703a139818 There is also a War Memorial, in the form of a Cross of Sacrifice to the British, Irish, French, Czechoslovak and Canadian servicemen.
