Prior to the 1890s teachers went to ranchers' families to provide educational services. In the late 1800s students wishing to attend high school traveled and resided in other communities/ In the 1890s a formal school was organized in Blue. Due to issues crossing the Blue River and transportation in general, there were three schools at a time in the early 20th century, with different campuses opening in 1912 and 1920, on the east and west sides of the Blue River, respectively, along with one in the Lower Blue Valley. The Blue Room is considered to be one of the earliest examples of a work from Picasso's Blue Period. Domestic staff used it for storage, kitchens, and maintenance. White House domestic staff gathered in this room to do mending and polish silver. In 1837, the Van Buren administration installed a furnace here for the White House's first central heating system. Later steam boilers replaced the gravity system, remaining until the 1902 renovation by McKim, Mead, and White. 70717d86b1

President's Dining Room The Dining Room is adjacent to the Family Kitchen, a small kitchen designed for use by the First Family, and served by a dumbwaiter connected to the main kitchen on the ground floor. It is located directly above the Family Dining Room on the State Floor and looks out upon the North Lawn. Diplomatic Reception Room The room has four doors, which lead to the Map Room, the Center Hall, the China

Room, and a vestibule that leads to the South Lawn. The room is the point of entry to the White House for a visiting head of state following the State Arrival Ceremony on the South Lawn. It is located on the ground floor and is used as an entrance from the South Lawn and a reception room for foreign ambassadors to present their credentials, a ceremony formerly conducted in the Blue Room 70717d86b1

East Room Since 1964, the Committee for the Preservation of the White House has, by executive order, advised the president of the United States and first lady on the decor, preservation, and conservation of the East Room and other public rooms at the White House. The East Room was one of the last rooms to be finished and decorated, and it has undergone substantial redecoration over the past two centuries. Beginning in the 19th century the space was occupied by a bedroom suite known as the Prince of Wales Room, named for an 1860 stay by the then-Prince of Wales, Albert Edward. From 1929 to 1948, this suite was known as the Lincoln Bedroom, with furnishings acquired by First Lady Mary Todd Lincoln (the current Lincoln Bedroom is now down the hall, in what was Lincoln's office suite). circumstances == 70717d86b1 In 1962 a new two story building opened at the current location, with the lower floor used for classes and the upper floor an apartment for the teacher. Vinson Greer described the building as being a "traditional little white school house". This building, wooden and painted red and... 70717d86b1 The residence was designed by the Irish-born architect James Hoban in the Neoclassical style. Hoban modeled the building on Leinster House in Dublin, a building which today houses the Oireachtas, the Irish legislature. Constructed between 1792 and 1800, its exterior walls are Aquia Creek sandstone painted white. When Thomas Jefferson moved into the house in 1801, he and his architect Benjamin Henry Latrobe added low colonnades on each wing to conceal what then were stables and storage. In 1814, during the War of 1812, the mansion was set ablaze by British forces in the burning of Washington, destroying the interior and charring much of the exterior. Reconstruction began almost immediately, and President James Monroe moved into the partially reconstructed Executive Residence in October 1817. Exterior construction continued... 70717d86b1
