

David Scott Lee Buick Gmc

Widely regarded as one of the greatest drivers in NASCAR history, Waltrip won 84 NASCAR Cup Series races throughout his career, including the 1989 Daytona 500, a record five in the Coca-Cola 600 (formerly the World 600, 1978, 1979, 1985, 1988, 1989), and a track and Cup Series record for any driver at Bristol Motor Speedway with twelve (seven consecutive from 1981 to 1984). He is fifth on NASCAR's all-time wins list in the Cup Series, one behind Bobby Allison. In the modern era of NASCAR, only Jeff Gordon won more races than Waltrip. He is ranked fifth for all-time pole positions with 59, including all-time modern era highs with 35 on short tracks and eight on road courses. Competing in 809 Cup starts over four decades and 29 years (1972–2000), he has scored 271 top-fives and 390 top...

1991 Indianapolis 500 forced to qualify on the second day of time trials. Foyt and Al Unser. Rick Mears won from the pole position, becoming the third four-time winner of the Indy 500, joining A. The wreck during a practice run totaled his primary car, and broke a bone in his right foot. During time trials, Mears also established an Indy record by winning his sixth career pole position. J.
