China Room An early-19th-century The China Room is one of the rooms on the Ground Floor of the White House, the home of the president of the United States. by Stark Carpet Corporation. Almost all administrations are represented with a collection; however, a few are not - most recently, the Trump administration did not have a collection created and instead mainly used the china designed by Hillary Clinton during her time as First Lady. The room is primarily used by the first lady for teas, meetings, and smaller receptions. The collection ranges from George Washington's Chinese export china to Barack Obama's blue and white themed collection. The White House's collection of state china is displayed there. At the single window, gray velvet draperies, trimmed in red and white silk fringe, were installed cb1ccc48f1

For several years through 1983, the building housed the headquarters of Bank of the Commonwealth until that bank merged with Comerica. In 2002, a \$40-million renovation was completed. cb1ccc48f1 == History == cb1ccc48f1 Since construction, the home has undergone many changes. During the 1906 remodel, the original late 19th century Stick style structure was moved and essentially completely rebuilt. Alterations carried out between 1912 and 1965 obscured some of Wright's intended design. In 1976, a major fire destroyed or damaged much of the house. The house was immediately reconstructed and partially restored. This was furthered by another partial restoration by the current home owners. As a result of the remodels, the house today bears the work of at least four different...

cb1ccc48f1 Scheerbart had advocated a transformative new architecture of glass from his first novel, *Das Paradies*, through many subsequent works. In 1913 he attempted to organize a "Society for Glass Architecture," an effort that brought him into contact with the Expressionist Bruno Taut. In the following year Scheerbart published not one but two books on the subject: his non-fictional *Glass Architecture* made the case for its subject in a more rational and pragmatic basis, while *The Gray Cloth* provided a far more imaginative and lavish presentation of the same matter. cb1ccc48f1 == Description == cb1ccc48f1 The space measures just under 18 by 80 feet (5.5 by 24 m). It allows access to the elevator vestibule, Entrance Hall, East Room, Blue Room, Green Room, Red Room, and State Dining Room. The Grand Staircase is visible from an opening directly across from the Green Room.

cb1ccc48f1 It was built by Great Bend, Kansas, Lustron dealer Don Brack in 1949

and would have cost somewhat more than \$10,500. All exterior surfaces and walls and ceilings inside the house are porcelain enamel steel. It has an original built-in dining room china cabinet and pass-through to the kitchen, which identifies the house as a "Deluxe" edition of Lustron's Westchester house model. Other porcelain enamel built-in features include bookcases, a mirrored vanity, and closets and overhead storage. cb1ccc48f1

State Dining Room of the White House These included American bison, elk, moose, and white-tailed deer, among others. The room seats 140 and measures approximately 48 by 36 feet (15 by 11 m). The exact style of these side tables is not clear. The house is a three-story brick structure, rectangular in shape, with a three-story ell extending the rear. The brick is laid in Flemish bond, and the trim is white marble. The roof is surrounded by a low balustrade above a modillioned cornice, and is pierced by two interior brick chimneys. There are marble trim bands separating the floors, and the third floor windows are shortened. All windows have black shutters, and are topped by lintels with a keystone. The main entrance is sheltered by an elliptical portico supported by four Corinthian columns. The doorway is framed by sidelight windows and an elliptical fanlight, with pilasters rising to the base of the portico top. The house interior features lavishly carved woodwork in the public spaces on the first floor, including fireplace mantels... cb1ccc48f1

Gardner-Pingree House It is owned by the Peabody Essex Museum as part of its architectural collection. It is judged to be a masterpiece of Federal architecture by the noted Salem builder Samuel McIntire, and was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1972 for its architectural significance. == McKim refinishing == cb1ccc48f1 Until late 1902 when the room was refinished as a public entertainment space during renovations directed by Charles Follen McKim, this room, along with most of the ground floor of the residence, was used for household work and general storage. McKim rebuilt the room with details from the late Georgian period, including robust cove moldings. cb1ccc48f1 The building was constructed between 1910 and 1912 and known for many years as the Dime Building. When completed, the tower was named the Dime Savings Bank Building

for its primary tenant. It was later renamed the Commonwealth Building, briefly known as Griswold Place. It became the Dime Building again in 2002, before being renamed in 2012. cb1ccc48f1 == Architecture and furnishings == cb1ccc48f1 == Glass architecture == cb1ccc48f1 The current architectural appearance dates to the 1952 Truman reconstruction, which recreated much of the 1902 renovation by the firm of McKim, Mead and White. The Truman reconstruction replaced the golden-hued Joliet stone floors, columns and pilasters with a cool gray marble. Plaster walls divided by a dado and painted cream and gold were also replaced with marble. McKim employed Roman doric columns based directly on the work of the sixteenth-century Italian architect Giacomo Barozzi da Vignola for the screen... cb1ccc48f1

Chrysler House The steel-framed structure is faced with white glazed brick and terra cotta trim. It was originally known as the Dime Building but has carried numerous names over the years. Edward R. Hills House Dr. S. The Hills-DeCaro House represents the melding of two distinct phases in Wright's career; it contains many elements of both the Prairie style and the designs with which Wright experimented throughout the 1890s. Hills House, also known as the Hills-DeCaro House, is a residence located at 313 Forest Avenue in Oak Park, a suburb of Chicago, Illinois, United States. It is most notable for a 1906 remodel by architect Frank Lloyd Wright in his signature Prairie style. Gray sold the house to his son Frank Sherwood Gray, but William Gray was again

Originally office space, the State Dining Room received its name during the presidency of James Monroe, at which time it was first extensively furnished. The room was refurbished during several administrations in the early to mid 1800s, and gasified in 1853. Doors were cut through the west wall in 1877. The State Dining Room underwent a major expansion and renovation in 1902, transforming it from a Victorian dining room into a "baronial" dining hall of the early 19th century—complete with stuffed animal heads on the walls and dark oak panelling.
