The first attestation of the French form of the name known to Elliott Coues was in the writing of the Vérendrye brothers, who in 1738 wrote of "La Fourche des Assiliboiles". The place-name arises from the largely North American usage of the noun fork to mean "the point at which a river divides into two, or the point of junction of two rivers; a branch or tributary". In 1869, the area was ceded by the Hudson's Bay Company to Canada, becoming a focal point for European settlement. Charleswood was incorporated as a Rural Municipality in 1913 and maintained its independence until 1972, when it was merged with the City of Winnipeg during the city's amalgamation. The city is named after the nearby Lake Winnipeg; the name "Winnipeg" comes from the Western Cree words for "muddy water" - winipîhk. The region was a trading centre for Indigenous peoples long before the arrival of Europeans; it is the traditional territory of the Anishinaabe (Ojibway), Ininew (Cree), Oji-Cree, Dene, and Dakota, and is the birthplace of the Métis Nation. French traders built the first fort, Fort Rouge, on the site in 1738. A settlement was later founded by the Selkirk settlers of the Red River Colony in 1812, the nucleus of which was incorporated as the "City of Winnipeg" in 1873. Being far inland, the city's climate is extremely seasonal (continental) even by Canadian standards, with average January highs of around -11 °C (12 °F) and average July highs...
