Potatoes were domesticated there about 7,000–10,000 years ago from a species in the *S. brevicaulle* complex. Many varieties of the potato are cultivated in the Andes region of South America, where the species is indigenous. Edible young greens are produced from various kinds of vegetables, herbs, or other plants. They range in size from 1 to 3 inches (2.5 to 7.6 cm), including the stem and leaves. The stem is cut just above the soil line during harvesting. Microgreens have fully developed cotyledon leaves and usually, one pair of small, partially developed true leaves. == Square foot gardening ==

Pringles Pringles are technically considered an extruded snack because of the manufacturing process. Pringles failed to meet the

definition of a potato "chip" since they were made from a potato-based dough rather than being sliced from potatoes. The brand was sold in 2012 to Kellanova, which in 2024 was purchased by Mars Inc. The US Food Pringles is an American brand of stackable potato-based chips invented by Procter & Gamble (P&G) in 1968 and marketed as "Pringle's Newfangled Potato Chips"

History of the potato The earliest archaeologically verified potato tuber remains have been found at the coastal site of Ancón (central Peru), dating to 2500 BC. letting potatoes freeze overnight allowing them to thaw in the morning which they repeated to soften the potatoes. The potato has since spread around the world and has become a staple crop in most countries. Cultivation of potatoes in South America may go back 10,000 years, but tubers do not preserve well in the archaeological record, making identification difficult. Aside from actual remains, the potato is also found in the Peruvian archaeological record as a design influence of ceramic pottery, often in the shape of vessels. Then, farmers extracted the potatoes' water The potato was the first domesticated root vegetable in the region of modern-day southern Peru and extreme northwestern Bolivia between 8000 and 5000 BC

Growing to about 6 ft (1.8 m) tall and broad, it is a rounded evergreen shrub with a somewhat lax, sprawling habit. The branches are slender and diverge sharply from the nodes. Internodes are approximately 5 centimetres (2.0 in) long. Young twigs are sparsely pubescent, becoming glabrous with age. The indumentum consists predominantly of simple trichomes, with only a small proportion of branched trichomes. The leaves are thin, entire and ovate to elliptic in shape, with an acute to acuminate apex and occasionally a slightly undulate margin. They are borne on short petioles and are sparsely pubescent. Mature leaves are typically 5 to 7 centimetres (2.0 to 2.8 in) long and 3 to 4 centimetres (1.2 to 1.6 in) wide, although some may reach nearly twice these dimensions.

The sweet potato is native to the tropical regions of South America in modern Ecuador. Of the approximately 50 genera and more than 1,000 species of Convolvulaceae, *I. batatas* is the only crop plant of major importance—some others are used locally (e.g., *I. aquatica* 'kangkong' as a green vegetable), but many are poisonous. The genus *Ipomoea* that contains the sweet potato also includes several garden flowers called morning glories, but that term is not usually extended to *I. batatas*.
