Harlequin cabbage bug black-and-white striped, laid in clutches of twelve. In the northern range there is only one generation annually and the insects overwinter as adults in crop residues or field edges. Harlequin bugs are phytophagous insects. Nymphs are active during the summer and in the tropics the bug can achieve three to six generations a year. Organic control involves hand-picking the insects off the plants (they can be dropped into soapy water to drown them) and being especially careful to remove and destroy all the eggs, which are black-and-white

The body is shield-shaped with prominent, well-defined "shoulders." Adults and nymphs feed on the stems and leaves of plants such as cabbage, broccoli, kale, turnip, radish, horseradish, mustard and rapeseed, and often cause blotching by their piercing-sucking feeding. In September 1998, it was collected in Allentown, Pennsylvania, where it is

believed to have been accidentally introduced. The nymphs and adults of the brown marmorated stink bug feed on over 100 species of plants, including many agricultural crops, and by 2010–11 had become a season-long pest in orchards in the Eastern United States. In 2010, in the Mid-Atlantic United States, \$37 million in apple crops were lost, and some stone fruit growers lost more than 90% of their crops. marmorated stink bugs are approximately 1.7 cm (0.67 in). Since the 2010s, the bug has spread to countries such as Georgia and Turkey and caused extensive damage to hazelnut production. It is now established in many parts of North America and has recently become established in Europe and South America 5dd726a643

Spined soldier bug feeding on prey using their tubular mouthparts, which they can extend forward in front of the body. As a generalist predator of many agricultural pests, *P. maculiventris* is generally considered a beneficial insect in gardens and crop fields. It has prominent spines on each "shoulder" and preys on a wide variety of arthropods, particularly the larval forms of Lepidoptera and Coleoptera. This differs from plant-feeding stink bugs where the *Podisus maculiventris*, the spined soldier bug, is a medium-sized predatory shield bug common in North America 5dd726a643

It is native to North America west of the Rocky Mountains (California to British Columbia, east to Idaho, Minnesota, and Nevada) but has in recent times expanded its range to eastern North America, to include Ontario, Québec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Michigan, Maine, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, and Wisconsin, and has become an accidental introduced species in parts of Europe and Argentina. seed bugs are sometimes colloquially called stink bugs 5dd726a643

Scutelleridae They are commonly known as jewel (stink) bugs or metallic shield bugs due to their often unique coloration. With the name based on the Asian genus *Scutellera*, they are also known as shield-backed bugs due to the enlargement of the thoracic scutellum into a continuous shield over the abdomen and wings. There are around 450 species worldwide. of true bugs. This latter characteristic distinguishes them from most other families within Heteroptera, and may lead to misidentification as a beetle rather than a bug. These insects use their piercing-sucking mouthparts to feed on plant juices from a variety of different species, including some commercial crops. Closely related to stink bugs, they may also produce an offensive odour when disturbed 5dd726a643

Jewel bugs are small to medium-sized, oval-shaped bugs with a body length averaging 5 to 20 mm (0.20 to 0.79 in). They can easily be distinguished from stink bugs (Pentatomidae) because the shield-like enlarged last section of their thorax (known as the scutellum, Latin for "little shield") completely covers the abdomen and the wings. 5dd726a643

Anthocoridae are 1.5–5 mm long and have soft, elongated oval, flat bodies, often patterned in black and white. The head is extended forward and the antennae are longer than the head and visible from above. They possess a piercing and sucking three-segmented beak or labium used to inject prey with digestive enzymes and consume food. In general appearance, they resemble common plant bugs (Miridae), but Anthocoridae differ by their possession of two ocelli as adults. Anthocorids possess two pairs of wings with hemelytra and membranous hindwings. 5dd726a643 Certain plants have shown effectiveness as topical repellents for haematophagous insects, such as the use of lemon eucalyptus sourced P-Menthane-3,8-diol, but incomplete research and misunderstood applications can produce variable results. 5dd726a643

Adults and nymphs can be observed sucking and feeding on prey using their tubular mouthparts, which they can extend forward in front of the body. This differs from plant-feeding stink bugs where the mouthparts point downward when feeding. Both plant-feeding and predaceous stink bugs can fold their mouthparts backward underneath the body. 5dd726a643 The essential oils of many plants are also well known for their pest-repellent properties. Oils from the families Lamiaceae (mints), Poaceae (true grasses), and Pinaceae (pines) are common haematophagous insect repellents worldwide. 5dd726a643 *B. leucopterus* is about 4 mm (0.16 in) long when fully developed. The adults' bodies vary in colour from dark red to brown with white wings and red legs. Young nymphs are usually bright red and half the size of adults. A distinguishable feature is the white band found on the nymph's abdomen. Sehirus cinctus They feed on plants in the Urticaceae (nettle) and Lamiaceae (mint) families. Females can have up to two broods, and parental care is initiated from chemical cues in the eggs. These bugs are somewhat unusual in that they exhibit brooding behavior. After the young hatch, the mother will bring food to them in the burrow for 1–3 days, after which the young will leave and forage on their own. The female deposits eggs, about 120–150, in shallow burrows and watches over them. Heteroptera, they are true bugs. They feed on plants in the Urticaceae (nettle) and Lamiaceae (mint)
