

No 10 Downing Street

The garden's adjacency to the official residence and use for press conferences has drawn comparisons to the White House Rose Garden. This similarity has lead to the garden being nicknamed the 'Rose Garden', though journalist Victoria Summerley, writing in Great Gardens of London, considers this "inaccurate". 602299dcaa There has been a resident cat in the British government employed as a mouser and pet since the 16th century, although modern records date only to the 1920s. Despite other cats having served Downing Street, the first one to be given the official title of chief mouser by the British government was Larry in 2011. The Prime Minister's official residence is 10 Downing Street, and the Chancellor's official residence is Number 11. The government's Chief Whip has an official residence at Number 12. Over time, government offices and officials came to occupy most of the street's townhouses. The houses on the south side of the street were demolished in the 19th century to make way for government offices now occupied by the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office. Opposite, for part of the street, the Cabinet Office, initially Treasury, was built to face Whitehall. 602299dcaa Number 11 is part of a (blackened) yellow-brick Georgian-era converted mansion. == Background == 602299dcaa It is over 300 years old, is a Grade I listed building, and contains approximately 100 rooms. A private residence for the prime minister occupies the third floor and there is a kitchen in the basement. The other floors contain offices and conference, reception, sitting and dining rooms where the prime minister works, and where government ministers, national leaders, and foreign dignitaries are met and hosted. At the rear is an interior courtyard and a terrace overlooking a 1/2-acre (0.2 ha) garden. Number 10 is adjacent to St James's Park, approximately 3/4 mile (1.2 km) from Buckingham Palace, the official residence of the British monarch in London, and is near the Palace of Westminster, the meeting

place of both Houses of Parliament. 602299dcaa The tradition began in 1982 while Margaret Thatcher was in office. Banham... 602299dcaa The role of chief of staff initially had executive authority, vested by the prime minister, and at the time of its inception, was referred to as the most powerful unelected official in the UK and possibly ranked third in government, after the prime minister and the chancellor of the exchequer. == History == 602299dcaa Number 10 was originally three houses: a stately mansion overlooking St James's Park called "the house at the back" built around 1530, a modest townhouse
