McMillan Fountain C. Cast by Roman Bronze Works, the fountain was originally part of a large landscape setting designed by Charles A. The partially reconstructed fountain currently resides near its original location at McMillan Reservoir in the Bloomingdale neighborhood of Washington, D. Washington. It was dismantled in 1941 and moved to storage. The fountain, completed in 1912, emplaced in 1913 and dedicated after October 1919, consists of a sculptural group of the Three Graces placed upon a pink granite base.
