It electrified its mainline between Stamford, Connecticut, and Woodlawn, New York, in 1907 and extended the electrification to New Haven, Connecticut, in 1914. The significance of this electrification was recognized in 1982 by its designation as a Historic Mechanical Engineering Landmark by the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME). While single-phase AC railroad electrification has become commonplace, the New Haven's system was unprecedented at the time of construction d97a847668

In some older definitions, a tax haven also offers financial secrecy. In contrast, countries with lower levels of secrecy but also low "effective" rates of taxation, most notably Ireland in the FSI rankings, appear in most § Tax haven lists. The consensus on effective tax rates has led academics to note that the term "tax haven" and "offshore financial centre" are almost synonymous. Union Station (New Haven) Designed by noted American architect Cass Gilbert, the present beaux-arts Union Station was completed and opened in 1920 after the previous Union Station (which was located at the foot of Meadow Street, near the site of the current Union Station parking garage) was destroyed by fire. It served the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad for the next five decades, but fell into decline following World War II along with the United States railroad industry as a whole. It is the third such station in the city of New Haven, preceded by both an 1848 built station in a different location, and an 1879 built station near the current station's location. Shore Line East In 2025, the system had 246,600 riders, with weekday average ridership of 700 in the first quarter of 2026. The rail service is a fully owned subsidiary of the Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) and is operated under the CT Rail brand. Penn Shore Line East (SLE) is a commuter rail service which operates along the Northeast Corridor through southern Connecticut, United States. Cross-platform transfers to Metro-North Railroad New Haven Line trains are available at New Haven for service to southwestern Connecticut and New York City. Intercity service continued, but generally only stopped at New Haven, Old Saybrook, and New London. commuter service east of New Haven was abandoned. A North Haven town meeting authorized sale of land for the mall at \$18,000 an acre, for a total of \$507,600 in 1973. Stamford Transportation Center McKinney Transportation Center or the Stamford Transportation Center, is a major railroad station in the city of Stamford, Connecticut, serving passengers traveling on Metro-North Railroad's New Haven Line, and Amtrak's Northeast Corridor. This Stamford station, officially known as the Stewart B. Central and Stamford (with Harlem 125th Street as the only intermediate stop for most trains), before running locally between Stamford and New Haven. Its official name honors politician Stewart McKinney. In addition, it is a major bus terminal for Peter Pan, and CTtransit buses. In 2018, the station averaged over 15,000 Metro-North boardings on weekdays, making it the second-busiest station on the network, behind Grand Central Terminal d97a847668

New Haven was one of the first planned cities in the U.S. A year after its founding by English Puritans in 1638, eight streets were laid out in a three-by-three grid, creating the "Nine Square Plan". The central common block is the New Haven Green, a 16-acre (6 ha) square at the center of Downtown New Haven. The Green is now a National Historic Landmark, and the "Nine Square Plan" is recognized by the American Planning Association as a National Planning Landmark. d97a847668

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
