

Model T Ford Sedan

By February 4, 1929, one million Model As had been sold, and by July 24, two million. The range of body styles ran from the Tudor at US\$500 (in grey, green, or black) (\$9,375 in 2025 dollars) to the town car with a dual cowl at US\$1,200 (\$22,500 in 2025 dollars). In March 1930, Model A sales hit three million, and there were nine body styles available.

Model A production ended in March 1932, after 4,858,644 had been made in all body styles. Its successor was the Model B, which featured an updated inline four-cylinder engine, as well as the Model 18, which introduced Ford's new flathead (sidevalve) V8 engine.

Ford Model T It is generally regarded as the first The Ford Model T is an automobile that was produced by the Ford Motor Company from October 1, 1908, to May 26, 1927. The savings from mass production allowed the price to decline from \$780 in 1910 (equivalent to \$26,952 in 2025) to \$290 in 1924 (\$5,448 in 2025 dollars). It is generally regarded as the first mass-affordable automobile, which made car travel available to middle-class Americans. The relatively low price was partly the result of Ford's efficient fabrication, including assembly line production instead of individual handcrafting. The sixth generation became the first version of the Taurus developed without a Mercury Sable counterpart, as Mercury began to pare down its model line.
