Dead-character costume Despite the character being "killed" only once on-screen, multiple identical costumes are typically used for several takes and scenes to ensure consistency and continuity, as the irreversible damage caused by squibs or blood effects limit their reusability. Bullet hit squibs on a waterproof down jacket The hero jacket without any modifications used for all scenes except when the actor is "shot" A dead-character costume is a set of stage clothes specially designed or modified for actors portraying characters killed on screen or on stage. They are used to depict gunshot or stab wounds, damage and the visual aftermath of violence, and are usually prepared by integrating special-effect devices such as blood squibs or prosthetics. They are sent to separate costume racks and disposed of afterwards, unlike other clothing articles that may return to the costume shop. These costumes serve as a metaphorical canvas to portray injury and death without the need for digital post-production effects. facilitates cleanup

Modern raincoats are often constructed from waterproof fabrics that are breathable, such as Gore-Tex or Tyvek and DWR-coated nylon. These fabrics and membranes allow water vapor to pass through, allowing the garment to 'breathe' so that the sweat of the wearer can escape. The amount of pouring rain a raincoat can handle is sometimes measured in the unit millimeters, water gauge. Polar fleece is used in jackets, hats, sweaters, sweatpants, cloth diapers (nappies), gym clothes, hoodies, pajamas, blankets, and high-performance outdoor clothing. The produced fleece can be used to create clothes that are very light, soft, and easy to wash. Polar fleece can stretch more easily in one direction than in others. Waterproofing is used in reference to building structures (such as basements, decks, or wet areas), watercraft, canvas, clothing (raincoats or waders), electronic devices and paper packaging (such as cartons for liquids). == Definition and specifications == A spraydeck is made of water-tight cloth or neoprene or nylon. It is sized to fit over the opening, or cockpit, of the canoe or kayak, with holes for the waists of the passengers. The spraydeck generally seals around the rim of the cockpit and around the torso of each passenger.

These fabrics and membranes allow water A raincoat is a waterproof or water-resistant garment worn on the upper body to shield the wearer from rain. Rain clothing may also be in one piece, like a boilersuit. The term rain jacket is sometimes used to refer to raincoats with long sleeves that are waist-length. often constructed from waterproof fabrics that are breathable, such as Gore-Tex or Tyvek and DWR-coated nylon. A rain jacket may be combined with a pair of rain pants to make a rainsuit c491c272f7

Waterproofing Such items may be used in wet environments or underwater to specified depths. waterproof by using a variety of methods, including but not limited to, the application of beeswax, waterproofing spray, or mink oil. **Waterproofing methods** Waterproofing is the process of making an object, person or structure water-resistant so that it remains relatively unaffected by water or resists the ingress of water under specified conditions c491c272f7

Costume selection should consider script requirements, possibility for modification, aesthetics, and budget. If fake blood is used, the outfit's colour should be bright or have sufficient set lighting to show bloodstains. Typically, 3-6 or even 8 identical stunt pieces are modified for the planned takes, rehearsals... c491c272f7 Many kayakers do not use a tuilik, but instead a separate spray skirt and kayaking top (often a drytop, something like a drysuit jacket), which usually seals around the waist, arms, and neck. A tuilik integrates the skirt and top into one piece of clothing, with a hood-edge seal rather than a neck seal. Tuiliks are generally less restrictive of motion, but the fit is finnickier. c491c272f7 **Spraydecks** are used in breaking waves, on whitewater, in inclement weather, and in splashy sports. Durable water repellent Most factory-applied treatments are fluoropolymer based. This saturation, called 'wetting out,' can reduce the garment's breathability (moisture transport through the breathable membrane) and let water through. Durable water repellents are commonly used in conjunction with waterproof breathable fabrics such as Gore-Tex to prevent the outer layer of fabric from becoming saturated with water. As the DWR wears off over time, re-treatment is recommended when necessary. Many spray-on and wash-in products for treatment of non-waterproof garments and re-treatment of proofed garments losing their water-repellency are available. commonly used in conjunction with waterproof breathable fabrics such as Gore-Tex to prevent the outer layer of fabric from becoming saturated with water **Durable water repellent**, or DWR, is a coating or finish added to fabrics at the factory to make them water-resistant (hydrophobic) c491c272f7

The air trapped in a tuilik makes rolling easier. If the paddler comes out of their kayak, a tuilik provides considerable initial buoyancy, and the legs may be drawn up into the air pocket. A flotation device may be worn over or under a tuilik or tuiliusaq. In construction == Costume considerations == Some researchers have suggested that the use of PFAS... usually consist of a backing woven from polyester fibers with a surface coating of shiny plastic. The plastic layer itself is typically a blend of PVC and polyurethane (PU), with 100% PVC producing a stiff fabric with a glossy shine and 100% PU producing a stretchy fabric with a silky shine (see PU laminate). Each opening in a spraydeck must make a fairly watertight seal. The seal varies in quality. The deck can be made to seal in several ways, including elastic fabric, a hem containing an elastic cord and/or drawstring, and both. In summer months an akuilisaq (a spray skirt or spray deck) may be used instead. Methods for factory application of DWR treatments involve applying a solution of a chemical onto the surface of the fabric by spraying or dipping, or chemical vapor deposition (CVD). The advantages of CVD include reducing the use of environmentally harmful solvents; requiring less DWR; and an extremely thin waterproof layer that has less effect on the natural look and feel of the fabric. Water-resistant and waterproof often refer to resistance to penetration of water in its liquid state and possibly under pressure, whereas damp proof refers to resistance to humidity or dampness. Permeation of water vapour through a material or structure is reported as a moisture vapor transmission rate (MVTR). A manufacturer's label may say, for example, 67% polyester, 33% polyurethane for a fabric that contains no PVC; or 80% polyvinyl chloride, 20% polyurethane with mention of the polyester backing omitted. PVC clothing is a highly resistant material and waterproof. PVC can be produced in bright colors (black, red, white, blue, orange, pink, silver, striped, etc.), adding visual appeal to the physical sensations produced by wearing the material. PolarFleece is a trademark registered by Malden Mills (now Polartec, LLC) with the United States Patent and Trademark Office on October 6, 1981. Malden Mills developed polar fleece in 1979. == Fit == Waterproof fabrics may also include waterproof-breathable fabrics, which are fabrics that allow water vapor to move across the fabric while still resisting liquid water and wetting.

Waterproof fabric Examples include the rubberized fabric used in Mackintosh jackets, sauna suits, and inflatable boats. Treatment could be either of the fabric during manufacture or of completed products after manufacture.

Tuulik Some now use polyurethane laminate fabrics (including fleeces) A tuulik is an Inuit watertight jacket, used when paddling a kayak. In this way the paddler can capsize and come back upright (using an Eskimo Rescue or kayak roll) without getting wet, and without getting any water into the kayak. It is sealed at the face, at the wrists and around the cockpit coaming. also made from waterproof, breathable laminate fabrics similar to those used for rain jackets c491c272f7

PVC clothing PVC plastic is often called "vinyl" and this type of clothing is commonly known as vinyl clothing. A manufacturer's label may say, for example PVC clothing is shiny clothing made from the plastic polyvinyl chloride (PVC).
